 $æ^3 ¢ ç ¾...å^{-}$ is a fruit that can grow to more than 20 kilograms in weight. $æ^3 ¢ ç ¾...å^{-}$ is called jackfruit (*Artocarpus heterophyllus*) in English, a name taken from Malayalam by the Portuguese. The jackfruit has a pungent smell, much like that of the durian. If you have tasted it before, you might like it too.

This fruit can be eaten raw or cooked. It is also a relative of the breadfruit.
